## **Guidelines for Contributors**

The Journal of Defence Studies (JDS) primarily deals with defence affairs and national security issues and provides latest perspectives on these issues. Each issue covers varied themes as affecting the Indian Armed Forces to include emerging security threats and scenarios, civil-military relations and higher defence planning, doctrines and concepts, organizations and structures, command and control mechanisms, logistical support and sustainability issues, budgeting procedures and practices and other related issues in the defence field. The journal serves as a platform for sharing research findings and opinions of scholars working on defence-related issues, both within and outside IDSA.

The Journal of Defence Studies welcomes contributors to submit well-researched papers. Contributors may deal with matters of contemporary debate or historical analysis, primarily relating to defence and security issues that have policy relevance. The journal carries two categories of contributions: full-length analytical articles of about 4000-6000 words and commentaries or review of about 2000-3000 words. The Editor reserves the right to make alterations. The submitted articles should be original copies of the author and have not been published or submitted to any other media or organization.

## **Submission of Typescripts**

Contributors are requested to follow the Guidelines given below:

- An abstract of about 100 words should be included to describe the main argument and the conclusions of the paper. The Abstract cannot contain endnote references.
- The first page should carry details of the author's biodata (a brief resume of about 50 words) and institutional affiliation.
- If actual statements or phrases are taken from another paper, the name of the author should be mentioned in the text and the chosen material should be placed within quotation marks with an appropriate reference. Alternatively, if another author's views are to be summarized, use the formulation: 'The views of xyz are summarised; give a crisp summary.

## References/Endnotes

- References/Endnotes should be sequentially numbered.
- The authors are responsible for accuracy of the references.
- Different guidelines are to be followed while references from publication or website sources. Follow the accustomed rules for respective type of references.
- If two successive citations/references refer to the same source, use ibid.

## **Other Important Guidelines**

- Use the font Times New Roman of size 12.
- Do not give page border.
- Do not insert page numbers.
- We accept only e-copies of research papers.
- Kindly send your full postal address, mobile/telephone number and email address along with your manuscript.
