ENQUIRY RE CALLING ATTENTION NOTICE ABOUT PRIME MINISTER'S PROPOSAL FOR NUCLEAR SHIELD FOR NON-NUCLEAR POWERS

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA (West Bengal): Sir, I gave a calling attention notice with regard to the newspaper report that the Prime Minister, while he was in London and was having his talks with the British Prime Minister, discussed a proposal for the so-called nuclear shield for the non-aligned powers, and this has certainly created very serious repercussions in various countries. I should like to know what exactly is the position. Initially it was thought that there was no truth in this news. Now the

Prime Minister's own statement makes it clear that this matter of nuclear shield was discussed in England, some sort of a nuclear umbrella.

SHRI C. D. PANDE (Uttar Pradesh): Jointly with other powers.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: I know that you would like to live under an American umbrella.

SHRI C. D. PANDE: Then you make the atom bomb.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: You do not believe in your own make. All that I would like is that the Prime Minister must make a statement on this subject. I would not like to hustle but since this matter has got the newspaper headlines not only in this country but other countries, I think the Prime Minister will be well advised to make a statement on the subject of this business of nuclear shield. We would like to know whether before making this proposal the Prime Minister had consultations with the Soviet Union. I cannot think of the Soviet Union and America being pulled together in this matter.

MR. CHAIRMAN: I have sent on your notice to the Prime Minister.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: The sooner it is made the better.
