people the circumstance that the sale of radio-active and stable isotopes has been advertised by the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, it is necessary to verify in each case whether a particular isotope is available. For example, the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission has advertised the evailable. For example, the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission has advertised the evailability of Foron 10, which is a stable isotope. Prof.P.S. Cill wished to have some of this isotope for making neutron counters, and I made enquiries from the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission. I was informed that none of the stable isotopes are for export to any country as the exount available in not sufficiently large (thic Josephio the advertisement). I have since verified from the Eritish and from Dr. Vallarta that the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission does not sell its stable isotopes to any foreign country. The same might be the position with regard to the fission products. If these are available then the whole complexion of Dr. A.K. Saha's scheme will change, and any money given towards it might lie unused for the time being. As soon as the above information is available we can take up the matter for consideration.
