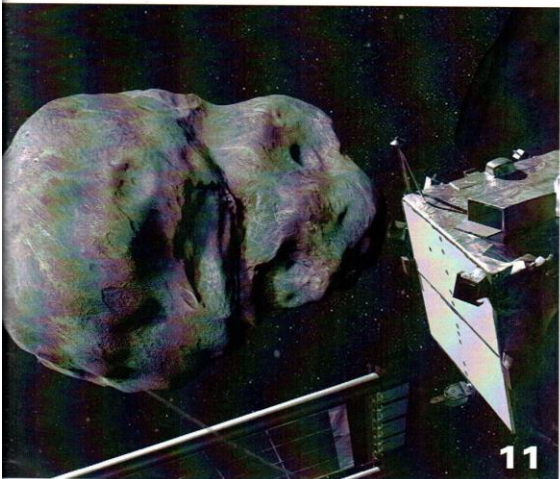

### 21 UN Security Council Holds Rare Disarmament Debate

Although the meeting underscored the urgency of addressing the nuclear weapons threat, it also highlighted chronic divisions among key states on disarmament and nonproliferation issues.

### 23 Europeans, U.S. Threaten Iran With IAEA Censure

The action could come at the next International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Board of Governors meeting if Iran does not meet its legally binding safeguards obligations.

### 24 Ukraine War Colors U.S. Concerns on Russia, North Korea

The intelligence community remains concerned that Russia could resort to the use of nuclear weapons in Ukraine and that North Korea is maneuvering to win acceptance as a nuclear- weapons state.

### 25 U.S. to Focus on Deterring North Korea

Washington still views negotiations as the only viable path to peace on the Korean peninsula but assesses that North Korean leader Kim Jong Un is intent on aligning more closely with Russia and China.

The test of India's first domestically produced missile carrying multiple warheads with independent targeting capability signals progress in advancing a nuclear deterrent against China.

### 29 Diplomatic Debate Over Autonomous Weapons Heats Up

The United States convened a conference on autonomous weapons in March, Austria has set one for April and the UN General Assembly plans a debate on the topic at its fall meeting.

### 30 Islamic State Group Blamed for Chemical Attack in Syria

As a result of the 2015 attack, 11 individuals showed symptoms consistent with exposure to sulphur mustard.

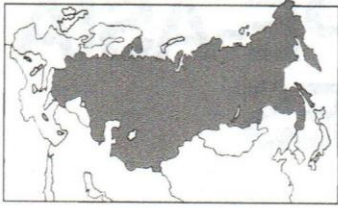

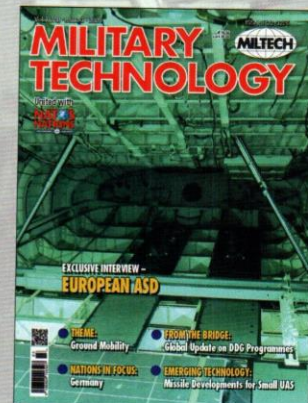

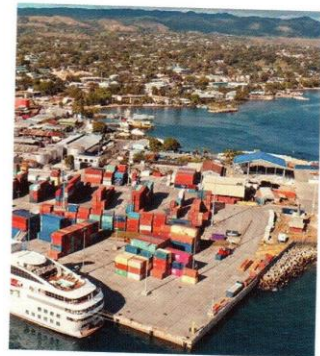
