

In this Edition

The China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) being built through Gilgit Baltistan is emerging as a source of contention not only between India, Pakistan and China but is also causing considerable political ripples within Pakistan. Earlier, there was widespread controversy resulting from the raging tussle amongst provinces on the preferred route of CPEC inside Pakistan. Besides, there are lurking uncertainties in the so called AJK and Gilgit Baltistan on whether the two regions would get a fair share in the project. Such fears have reached serious proportions, especially in Gilgit Baltistan, mainly for two reasons: despite the fact that the corridor crosses through Gilgit Baltistan before it enters into Pakistan, there is local unrest on whether or not its geographical criticality to CPEC will accrue tangible benefits to the region. The contours of the role that Gilgit Baltistan region will play in the upcoming connectivity corridor and the infrastructure projects therein, is also not clear.

There are complexities concerning Gilgit Baltistan's undefined political status. Since 1947, Gilgit Baltistan has been ruled by a series of temporary political arrangements without it ever being a part either of Pakistan or its constitution. Gilgit Baltistan is neither independent nor a province of Pakistan. The continuing political ambiguity has marred development in the Gilgit Baltistan region for decades. There are palpable aspirations amongst locals for political rights and economic development. Since the announcement of CPEC in April 2015, people in Gilgit Baltistan have been anxious on their political ambivalences fearing they would be handed, yet again, a raw deal by the establishment in Pakistan. According to reports included in the current issue, reflection of such scepticism is being witnessed in the so called AJK as well. In the so called AJK, the political class in its own way is seen convincing the local people that they would not be deprived of their due share in the CPEC and that the project will usher in peace and development in the region.

Shabbir Mir, “Court tells govt to appoint physically challenged first”

In what could be a landmark ruling, a Gilgit court directed the government to ensure that people with disabilities, women and minorities are appointed before other staff is appointed in any government department. The decision was handed down by the Gilgit-Baltistan Chief Court in response to a petition filed by two physically challenged women, seeking implementation of the government quota for people with special needs. The petitioners, Syeda Salmi Khanum and Tehreen Rasheed were the first to move court for their rights. “The respondents are legally bound to make recruitments against posts in strict adherence to the policy of first appointing women and minorities,” read the order addressed to chief secretary and secretaries of various departments.

This was stated President, All Jammu and Kashmir Muslim Conference and former Prime Minister of Azad Kashmir, Sardar Attique Ahmed Khan while speaking to Kashmiri community at Sindh Boy Scout auditorium on January 1. International community should play their role in implementing the United Nations’ resolution as Indian Prime Minister, Narendra Modi is planning resettling of Hindus in the held Kashmir, he stated, adding, making Gilgit-Baltistan a provincial unit have divided the mandate of Kashmiris. “Making Gilgit-Baltistan a provincial unit is also a conspiracy against Kashmiris,” he noted. “If the rulers are allowed to make their own wishes then they will make more provinces in Azad Kashmir, which will further divide the mandate of Kashmiris.” He claimed that divided National Conference in held Kashmir and Muslim Conference in Azad Kashmir is a conspiracy to further weaken the Kashmiris. “Political spat: Opposition slams G-B govt over Diamer’s ghost schools”

The leader of opposition in the Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) assembly on January 1 raised questions over the

government's resolve to improve the state of women's education in Diamer valley. Shah Baig of Jamiat Ulema Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) alleged that schools in the valley have turned into 'ghost schools'. "Schools in the valley are deserted and there is no one to look into this issue," noted Baig, who hails from the Diamer valley. "Those who are appointed as teachers have never visited their schools," he alleged, claiming that many other teachers had retired while never visiting their schools. "But what is interesting is that they are paid regularly." The valley has a population of over 200,000 with hardly 15 per cent of the men being educated while women's literacy rate is non-existent.

"India may let in people from Gilgit-Baltistan"

The upcoming 14th edition of Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD) will be held in Bengaluru from January 7 to 9 2017. In a briefing to talk about the PBD event, the Ministry of External Affairs indicated that if

people from the Gilgit-Baltistan region applied to attend the event, India would allow them in. In the past too, people from this region have attended the PBD events. But India's nod to them is likely to cause a further strain in the already tense India-Pak relationship. "PBD is an open event and people from Indian territory, including PIOs and NRIs, can seek online registration," stated Dnyaneshwar M Mulay, Secretary (Overseas Indian Affairs) at the briefing. When asked whether people from PoK have applied for registration, he stated there was no such information. The idea behind this is to give a push to the government's policy that Pakistan-occupied-Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan are part of the state of Jammu and Kashmir. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has himself raised the issue of Gilgit-Baltistan and PoK in his independence speech from the Red Fort and at an all-party meet. Both Modi and President Pranab Mukherjee will head to Bangalore to attend the PBD. The event will formally be inaugurated by Prime Minister Modi on January 8 and the valedictory session on January 9 will be addressed by President Mukherjee who will also confer Pravasi Bharatiya Samman to eminent overseas Indians.

MA Mir, "Pre-election rigging? Inquiry committee finds irregular hiring in AJK LG&RD"

The Local Government and Rural Development (LG&RD) department of the Azad Jammu and Kashmir region hired extra sub-engineers in March 2016, just four months before general elections in the region. This was discovered by a two-member committee formed by the AJK government to look into irregular appointments in the department. According to the report, the LG&RD had advertised 14 posts for sub-engineers. Three weeks later, around 140 hopefuls from 10 districts of AJK had subsequently appeared for written exams for the post. Corresponding interviews were conducted the very same evening without short-listing candidates who had passed the exam. The committee in their report noted that Abu Bakar Muzammil, an assistant

engineer at LG&RD department – who was included in the selection team for technical review – used a pencil for marking the papers. Consequently, when the Muzammil complied the results, he put his signatures in the column of the interview results instead of in the column of the written exam results hinting at alleged tampering. Moreover, together with interviews without short-listing, constituted violations of the stipulated regulations.

Shabbir Mir, “Fallout spreads: Alleged ‘insult’ pits top G-B bureaucrats against CM”

A letter allegedly written by secretaries serving in the Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) government against a statement by Chief Minister Hafeezur Rehman has been making the rounds in the local media and online. The unsigned letter was written by “All ‘down’ officers” and titled, “Vilification of federal officers on GBLA floor”. The vernacular word for ‘down’ may refer to down-country – the provinces – but without proper context, it can also mean lower class. The letter voiced serious reservations over a statement CM Rehman allegedly made on the floor of G-B Legislative Assembly (GBLA) on December 16 regarding foreign tours. “The statement has hit very close to the heart of every officer and has generated a very adverse response from each and every officer down the ladder,” read the letter without specifying what exactly the chief minister noted.

Engr. Sh. Mushtaq Ahmed, “AJK’s incredible hydropower potential”

Owing to its unmatched merits associated with hydropower generation over the other modes of power production, such as being efficient, economical, cheap, affordable, safe, sustainable, cost

effective, reliable, clean, green (no emissions of Green House Gases – GHGs) and above all having attainability of carbon credits from UN, Water is duly considered next to oil in its power generating potential. In this backdrop, the State of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) stands abundantly blessed and endowed with one of nature’s riches, water that is pulsating in its four rivers Jhelum (the most voluminous river of AJK), Neelum, Poonch and Kunhar in addition to numerous perennial nullahs, streams and brooks stretched along the territories of AJK. 114.4 MW of hydroelectricity being generated in AJK (Mangla power station 1000 MW, New Bong Escape 84 MW and Jagran-1 30.4 MW) is in the system through the national grid. Whereas her own demand in peak summer season is 350 MW. 17 macro hydropower projects mostly on run-of-river mode and a few on run-of-nullah mode of cumulative generation capacity 7566MW are in different phases of development and will offer a way out of crippling power outages when they become operational. It is, indeed, heartening to know that apart from macro hydropower projects, currently as much as 53 MW of electricity generated through 15 micro, mini and small hydropower stations is in the system and projects ranging from 50 KW (0.05 MW) to 49.5 MW are effectively in various implementation stages, from bankable feasibility studies to advance level of construction and further to commissioning mode.

Altaf Hameed Rao, “Mangla, Terbela dams’ working ‘comes to a halt’”

Azad Kashmir, where the largest reservoir of the country Mangla Dam is situated, has been suffering at least 12-hour a day loadshedding for many days as hydropower generation has almost come to a halt at Mangla, Terbela and Ghazi Barotha dams. The fall in power generation is due to a drastic slash in water level in the reservoirs following the complete lack of much-awaited rains on the upper reaches of the country, sources noted. “Yes, the power

distributing agencies including the AJK Electricity Department have to observe the forced loadshedding of electricity following an exceptional gap between demand and supply," stated an official of the State Electricity Department on condition of anonymity. The state-run AJK Electricity Department is the power distribution agency in Azad Jammu & Kashmir which is assigned to manage the supply of power to the consumers across the AJK territory being the main consumer of various power distributing agencies including IESCO, GEPCO, PESCO operating in Azad Jammu & Kashmir. "We are legally bound to observe the loadshedding of power in Azad Jammu & Kashmir by strictly following the schedule imposed by Wapda," the official stated. In Mangla Dam, the water level was reported to 1100.55 feet against the maximum conservation level of 1242 feet with live storage 0.630 million acre feet (MAF) on January 3. The minimum operating level of water in Mangla reservoir is 1,040 feet.

"Pakistan will continue to highlight Kashmir uprising, says Aziz"

Pakistan will continue to highlight the ongoing uprising in India-held Kashmir. This was stated by Adviser on Foreign Affairs Sartaj Aziz, signalling the government's determination to continue the policy of supporting the freedom movement in occupied Kashmir despite certain foreign policy challenges that have arisen because of it. "What initiative? Why any initiative? We would continue highlighting the Kashmir issue and the human rights violations there," Mr Aziz noted while responding to a question about any new planning for engaging India after 2016 in which perpetually adverse relations with India touched new lows. Analysts say the dysfunctional relationship between Islamabad and New Delhi dipped to levels unprecedented in peace time. Not only did India commit worst ceasefire violations since the 2003 agreement and Indian military claimed to have conducted cross-border 'surgical strikes' against

alleged terrorist hideouts in Azad Kashmir, New Delhi also launched an extensive international campaign to malign and isolate Pakistan.

“Pak govt plans 10-p/unit surcharge to cover Neelum-Jhelum project cost overruns”

The government is expected to impose 10-paisa per unit surcharge for all electricity consumers for at least 18 months to finance cost overruns of Rs500 billion Neelum-Jhelum Hydropower Project and extend Rs3 per unit reduction in power tariff for industrial consumers for six months. A senior government stated that a meeting of the Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet has been called on January 6 to approve two proposals moved by the Ministry of Water and Power following green signalled by the Prime Minister Office. The official stated the 10-paisa per unit surcharge was originally imposed in 2007 when the Neelum-Jhelum project cost was approved at Rs130bn with a sunset clause of Dec 31, 2015. It was envisaged that half of the financing would be generated through this surcharge on every unit of electricity sold to consumers in eight years. The cost of 969-megawatt run of the river project in Azad Kashmir kept on increasing with latest estimates at Rs500bn for targeted completion in 2018.

Earlier, an agreement regarding financial close of Suki Kinari hydropower project was signed at a ceremony. The project to be constructed on River Kunhar will help generate eight hundred and seventy megawatt electricity. It will be completed by 2022 at a cost of 1.80 billion rupees.

“Census: Head count in AJK from April 29”

Shabbir Mir, “G-B reluctant to consider Indian plans of new border Routes”

The government of Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) seems reluctant to consider Indian government plans to open new routes across the Line of Control (LoC) to reconnect divided families in G-B and Indian Kashmir. According to media reports, Governor of J&K Narinder Nath Vohra recently told a joint sitting of the J&K legislature that the state government was considering opening four new routes this year – Gurez-Astore-Gilgit, Jammu-Sialkot, Chamb Jaurian-Mirpur and Nowshera-Mirpur. “Three other routes – Kargil-Skardu, Turtuk-Khapulu, and Titwal-Chilhan across the Neelum Valley were also being explored,” he was quoted as saying. The statement drew a lukewarm response in G-B. The G-B government spokesman Faizullah Faraq cast doubt over Indian plans, saying the multi-billion economic corridor project with China might be behind Indian efforts to reconnect with Pakistan through new routes. “In the past, when Pakistan asked India about opening new routes to reconnect divided families, they did not respond,” Faraq noted on January 9. “They even didn’t consider the request on humanitarian grounds. What is new for them now, except for CPEC,” he noted, referring to Indian interest in the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), which G-B serves as a gateway for.

The mega Diamer-Basha Dam project on the Indus River is again in the news. Sadly, ground-breaking ceremony of the multi-purpose project has been held twice, in April 2006 and again in October 2011, but the project could not take-off as yet primarily due to lack of political will on the part of successive governments. This has resulted in improper planning, mismanagement and non-availability of necessary funds for the project. After getting stalled for a decade, the project is being revived and, interestingly, another ground-breaking ceremony is now planned sometime before the end of this year. Ironically, the project has also been approved more than once by the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC); on January 7, 2004 at \$6.4 billion project cost, on March 7, 2007 at revised cost \$8.5 billion, and again on November 6, 2008 at \$12.6 billion including the cost of compensation and resettlement of the affected local population. The PC-1 of the project was finally approved by the ECNEC on August 20, 2009 at a total cost of over Rs894 billion (\$12.6 billion at that time) including foreign exchange component of Rs313 billion, with the directive to implement the project on fast track. The huge cost over-run of the project over the years, without achieving any physical progress, is reflected in the revised cost estimate that has swelled already to \$13.96 billion.

In a bid to stop illegal construction on government land in different parts of Gilgit town, the local administration has imposed Section 144 and banned all sorts of construction, except those sponsored by the government itself. Violators are warned of facing up to three months in prison while the illegal structures built would be razed. Khalisa Sarkar (unoccupied and barren land) in different parts of Gilgit town have somewhat become a magnet for irregular constructions. These areas include near the university (north-west part of Gilgit town), near Kono Daas (northeast) and Chilmish Daas (an extension of Kono Daas also in the northeast of Gilgit town). “Sub-divisional magistrate Asghar Khan has banned the construction on Khalisa Sarkar under Section

144,” noted an official in the regional information department on January 15. “Structures made on that land, other than the ones built by the government, would be demolished,” the magistrate was quoted as saying. Under the law, the official stated, plantation and other activities such as blasting would also be prohibited on government land. The government claims that it owns the land, while locals have laid claim based on ancestral ownership.

IGP Aiwan stated Rs300-350 million money trail was also uncovered which he stated was linked to the purchase of weapons and properties. “The money reached here through various clandestine means,” he claimed.

over 100 murder cases and had a bounty of Rs3 million on his head. Another killed in encounter was identified as Noorul Amin, while one dead terrorist has not been identified yet.

Sources noted that the third meeting of the FFC was held in Gilgit on January 17 under the home secretary Gilgit and it was decided therein that the meeting of the FFC has been fixed on January 27 and this is the final date. If the journalist does not appear before it, then he would be arrested and presented before the committee. The journalist has collected more information about the GB scandal. The government is fearing if the statement is recorded under 164 or before a magistrate at the official level then it would create problems for the government.

“Mehbooba Mufti proposed creating trade corridor involving both IHK and Azad Kashmir”

The subcontinent was historically linked to Central Asia through Kashmir and “taking advantage of its geographical location, Jammu and Kashmir could become a nucleus towards forging a new economic alliance in the region”, Ms Mufti was quoted as saying while winding up the discussion on the Motion of Thanks on Governor’s Address. “The oil and gas resources of Central Asia are the nearest and most economical answers to South Asian energy needs and J&K can help foster energy cooperation in the region,” she stated. “This will create favourable conditions for Jammu and Kashmir to play its natural role of connecting the two emerging economic zones and lift itself out of political and economic fragility.” She stated: “Such an arrangement will supplement the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor through this part of Kashmir.” The trans-Kashmir corridor, with diverse sub-corridors, Ms Mufti stated, “was symbolic of relative peace, prosperity, cross-cultural and ideological fertilisation and human security until late 1940s”. India’s overland connections with its northern neighbourhood got ruptured due to partition in 1947, she noted.

Lawyers in Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) voiced concern over reports of the induction of a judge from outside the region in the Supreme Appellate Court (SAC). They claim an influential ruling party lawmaker has recommended the appointment. “We have credible information that an influential ruling party lawmaker from Mansehra is pushing for the appointment of his

‘near and dear one’ for the vacant post,” noted G-B High Court Bar Association President Malik Kifayat. Kifayat was referring to the SAC seat which fell vacant after Justice Shehzad Ali died last year. “We will not let this happen as we have competent people to fill the post,” Kifayat told the media in Gilgit. Under the law, the regional government forwards a summary containing three names to the federal government, and the prime minister, as the competent authority, can appoint one. Kifayat stated there was a panic among the lawyers about the issue which he noted was previously discussed in lawyers’ bodies. He stated besides judges, induction of locals in other administrative posts in the judiciary is the right of locals.

The government faces a series of challenges in exercising its political writ in the remote regions of the country. But it seems to have no palpable plans to address the sense of deprivation, political exclusion and economic marginalisation that exist in these areas. There are a host of political problems which can easily be resolved with some effort and meagre resources by introducing an inclusive social policy framework to engage people as primary actors rather than isolating and incarcerating them. Unreconstructed postcolonial states like Pakistan – which inherited a plethora of debilitating issues – are still fraught with the problems of territorial nationalism with legal and political infrastructure of bifurcated citizenship. The British colonial masters adopted the political instrument of indirect rule which strengthened the customary law for natives but reserved the civil law for settlers only. This created a political dichotomy of locals and non-locals that continues till date through nationalistic movements which claim their indigenous right to land, economy and culture and see outsiders as the enemy of indigenous political identities.

He further stated Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif also directed Federal Finance Minister Ishaq Dar for release of Rs 2.20 billion to the AJK on account of its outstanding funds from Kashmir Council.
