Turkish contractor IC İçtaş reaches deal with Russia on Akkuyu

Turkish contractor IC İçtaş got back the Akkuyu nuclear power plant construction contract after reaching an agreement with Russia, sources said Friday. Akkuyu is the world's first nuclear power plant project implemented through a build-own-operate model. Under the long-term contract, Rosatom has agreed to provide the power plant's design, construction, maintenance, operation and decommissioning. Last month, Russian state nuclear energy company Rosatom terminated a contract with IC İçtaş, its Turkish partner, over alleged "violations" in the contract.

Russian state firm signs \$9.1bn loan deal to fund nuclear plant in Türkiye

A Russian state-owned company signed a \$9.1bn loan deal with Gazprombank in August to fund the construction and development of Turkey's Akkuyu nuclear power plant, according to the official documents. In a public announcement on Wednesday, Rosatom Corp published the deal signed on 3 August, which opens a line of credit to finance Akkuyu Nuclear JSC, its subsidiary in Turkey. The official documents suggest the money would be used for the following: \$7bn for construction and operation of a nuclear power plant at the Akkuyu site, including four power units with VVER-1200 reactors. \$1.6bn for financing the acquisition and development of a uranium deposit in

Kazakhstan. \$500m for financing expenses for the acquisition and development of lithium assets.

He went on to say that the work will continue at a faster pace as they have to start operating the first unit in 2023.

US senators gave 'positive' feedback on F-16 fighters: Erdoğan

President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan on Tuesday said that he has received "positive" feedback from two U.S. senators he met with in New York on their potential support for the sale of F-16 fighter jets to Türkiye. Türkiye has been seeking to modernize its air fleet and sought to buy 40 F-16 jets and nearly 80 modernization kits from the U.S. President Joe Biden has said he supports the sale and that he would work to convince lawmakers to deliver the F-16 jets for Türkiye's air force. Erdoğan earlier this month said his country may turn to other countries such as Russia if the U.S. fails to follow through on its promise to deliver F-16s after a bill recently approved by American lawmakers created a new hurdle for any purchase by Türkiye.

Türkiye sells its famed battle-tested drones to UAE as ties mend

Turkish defense firm Baykar has delivered 20 of its pioneering armed drones to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) this month and could sell more, two sources said Wednesday, as a diplomatic detente between the former regional rivals expands into military contracts. International demand for Baykar's drones soared after their impact in conflicts in Syria, Ukraine and Libya, where their laser-guided armor-piercing bombs helped repel an offensive by UAE-supported forces two years ago. Now the United Arab Emirates and its ally Saudi Arabia are hoping to benefit from their rapprochement with Türkiye to counter a growing security challenge from Iran and its proxy forces, military sources say.

Array of new defense platforms to crown centennial of Republic of Türkiye

Daily Sabah, September 21, 2022

A range of new long-awaited platforms, which will be delivered in 2023 when Türkiye marks the 100th anniversary of the Republic, promise to display the latest breakthrough achieved by the lucrative Turkish defense industry. Aiming to provide security forces with the most advanced equipment developed with indigenous resources under the Presidency of Defense Industries (SSB), the Turkish defense industry will take critical steps in many projects in about a year. The National Combat Aircraft (MMU), the most

important technology project in the country and carried out by Turkish Aerospace Industries (TAI), will leave the hangar on March 18, 2023. The TF-X MMU, a fifth-generation jet with similar features to Lockheed Martin's F-35 Lightning II, will replace the F-16 jets, which are planned to be phased out by the 2030s. It will make its maiden flight in 2025 and start its duty in 2028.

Türkiye says Malaysia, Indonesia interested in buying its armed drones

Malaysia and Indonesia have expressed a keen interest in buying armed drones from Turkish defense firm Baykar, which has supplied the weapons to several countries after battlefield successes, Türkiye's top diplomat said on Monday. Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu also expressed hopes his country would be able to sell the unmanned combat aerial vehicles to Japan. "Many Asian countries, especially Malaysia and Indonesia, show great interest in our defense industry products. Agreements are being signed," Çavuşoğlu told a press conference in Tokyo. Türkiye sees big

potential in deepening defense ties with Japan, the minister said, on a visit there to attend the funeral of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe.

Türkiye armed unmanned vessel shows naval capacities in NATO drill

Turkish armed unmanned surface vehicle (AUSV) demonstrated its abilities at a recent NATO exercise in southwestern Portugal, becoming Türkiye's first such platform to join the alliance's military drill. Developed by Turkish defense pioneer Aselsan and the Sefine Shipyard in northwestern Yalova province under the coordination of the Presidency of Defense Industries (SSB), MARLIN took part in the drill with around 100 other unmanned aviation and marine vehicles. Around 20 ships were also part of the six-day exercise that began on Sunday and was named Dynamic Messenger 2022.

US cannot find another ally like Türkiye, Erdoğan says

Türkiye drones to be put into service in Albania soon: PM Rama

Albanian Prime Minister Edi Rama said Turkish-made Bayraktar drones agreed to be purchased by his country will be put into service very soon. "These satellites will be

followed very soon by (Bayraktar) drones. In line with new developments, we decided to complete them and buy armed drones," Edi Rama said at the signing of a satellite service contract between the Albanian National Civil Defense Agency and the firm Satellogic USA to monitor the country with advanced defense and security technology. "Of course, armed drones are for extreme situations against terrorism or a potential enemy. However, these drones have a number of complementary functions in harmony with satellites," he added. According to Rama, the agreement is worth \$6 million.

Air Force Command plans achieving 100% transfer of responsibility to Iraq

Air Force Command revealed Friday plans to achieve a 100% transfer of responsibility to Iraqi hands, while affirming the leadership in suppressing Daesh terrorism. The Commander of the Air Force, Lieutenant-General Shihab Jahid, told the Iraqi News Agency (INA): "The requirements that the Iraqi Air Force needs are of two types: technical and training," noting that "the requirements complete skills using weapons, reduce accidents and reflect positive results on affiliates, pilots and maintenance personnel. He added that "the Air Force has many foreign dealings, given that its weapons are diverse," noting that "each type of aircraft has contracts, maintenance with the manufacturer, and training courses so that Iraq is qualified to

work on it." He pointed out that "the Air Force is now in the modern planning period, and there is a prepared plan that started in 2020 to the end of 2025," noting that "the plan includes placing all aircraft operating in the Air Force with a transfer rate of more than 80%."

CTS: Cyber war is part of our duties to eliminate the remnants of ISIS

The Counter-Terrorism Service-CTS, today, Friday, clarified its basic tasks, and while stressing the existence of international cooperation to eliminate terrorists, he indicated that cyber war is part of its work because of its impact on security. CTS spokesperson, Sabah al-Numan, told the Iraqi News Agency (INA), that "CTS's primary mission is to combat terrorist crime and various terrorist crimes, not just field work or combat," noting that "part of CTS work is combating cyber war, which is a type of terrorist crime that, if exploited by terrorist organizations, would have a significant impact on security. " Al-Numan added, "The capabilities of the Counter-Terrorism Service and its mission, according to the CTS strategy, is to combat the causes and prevention of terrorism and combat all forms of terrorist crime, not just the field combat of ISIS and other organizations."

Iraqi security forces kill eight ISIS militants in country's north

CTS: We have a large database of ISIS leaders inside and outside the country

The Counter-Terrorism Service-CTS announced today, Sunday, that 90% of ISIS members are now local, while noting that the organization's remnants do not now pose any field or media threat. A spokesman for the Counter-Terrorism Service, Sabah al-Numan, said in a

statement to Al-Iraqiya News, which was followed by the Iraqi News Agency (INA), that "the anti-terrorist agency continues to pressure ISIS remnants and prevent them from carrying out terrorist operations," noting that "during September we carried out 117 operations, and arrested many terrorists, and we killed others, including leaders, while destroying their dens." Numan added, "The operations carried out by the Counter-Terrorism Service thwarted many of the intentions and plans of the organization," noting that "ISIS is trying to re-establish its presence and carry out operations, most of which are for media gain." He stated that "the agency has a large database of terrorists locally and abroad," explaining that "90% of the ISIS militants now are local."

Iraq summons Iranian ambassador after drone bombing campaign

Iraq summoned the Iranian ambassador on Thursday to deliver a diplomatic complaint following a deadly drone bombing campaign, the Iraqi Foreign Ministry said in a statement. The Iranian drones targeted an Iranian-Kurdish opposition group in northern Iraq on Wednesday, killing at least nine people and wounding 32 others. The strikes took place as demonstrations continued to engulf the Islamic Republic after the death of Mahsa Amini, a 22-year-old Iranian Kurdish woman who died while in the custody of the Iranian morality police. Iran's attacks targeted positions of the Democratic Party of Iranian Kurdistan in the town of Koya, some 65 kilometers (35 miles) east of Irbil, the main city and capital of Iraq's northern semi-autonomous Kurdish region. The group, known by the acronym KDPI, is a leftist armed opposition force banned in Iran.

Raisi: Guarantees needed to ensure 'lasting removal' of sanctions

Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi has said that U.S. sanctions must be lifted to reach an agreement to revive 2015 nuclear deal, noting guarantees must be established to ensure their "lasting removal". "Removal of sanctions should be accompanied with the resolution of safeguards. There are some political and baseless accusations against Islamic Republic of Iran when it comes to safeguard issues," Raisi told Al Jazeera in the city of Samarkand, where he attended the Shanghai Cooperation Organization meeting on Thursday. "So, we should finalize these safeguard issues," he said. "Regarding the guarantees, if we have the trustworthy guarantees, and we have the lasting removal of the sanctions, not temporary removal of sanctions, and if there is a lasting solution for the safeguard issues, for sure it is possible to reach agreement," the president said.

Xi calls ties with Iran strategic, backs Iran's membership in BRICS

The Chinese president on Friday praised Iran's independent position toward international developments and called the relations between Beijing and Tehran "strategic". "The relations of Iran and China is strategic and will develop irrespective of any international event," Xi Jinping said in a meeting with Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi who has attended the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) summit in Samarkand, Uzbekistan. Xi also pointed to Iran's important position in the region and the larger world and said, "China supports the membership of Iran in BRICS." BRICS is the acronym coined to associate five major emerging economies: Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa. Xi also invited Raisi to visit China.

Khalid Azizi, a spokesman for the KDPI, described Mahmoudzadeh as a well-known party member and retired peshmerga fighter who previously fought against Iranian regime forces when the KDPI was still engaged in armed activities.

Last week, the Kuwaiti Ministry of Interior announced the seizure of 1 million Captagon pills hidden inside plastic boxes of grapes. The previous successful seizure in Kuwait was in June, when 5 million pills were found. Other major hauls have also been revealed in the past few months, including Turkey seizing 12.3 million pills in August and Saudi Arabia’s 15 million in July, while Jordan expects the trade to more than double.

Qatar has previously served on the board of governors twice, from 2013 to 2015 and from 2016 to 2018. The 35-member board, which is in charge of the IAEA's main policy-making bodies, reviews and approves budgeting, operational programs, safeguards agreements and safety standards. It also has the authority, with the approval of the general conference, to appoint the agency's director general.

Yemeni forces say they have driven Al-Qaeda out of a key stronghold in the south of the country, after fierce fighting in which 32 soldiers and at least 24 militants were killed. Mohammed Al-Naqeeb, a

spokesman for the pro-independence Southern Transitional Council, which commands the military operations, told Arab News that the third phase of an offensive named “Eastern Arrows” had ended after their forces captured Omaran valley in Abyan province. He said 32 soldiers were killed and 42 wounded by Al-Qaeda counterattacks, booby traps and roadside bombs. The militants suffered 24 dead in combat or in the bombardment of Abyan’s high, rocky highlands.

UN envoy to Yemen Hans Grundberg in Riyadh for talks on truce expansion

UN Special Envoy to Yemen Hans Grundberg has visited Riyadh to discuss the expansion of the truce between the government and the Houthi rebel militia with Saudi and Yemeni officials. The UN-brokered truce, which began in April and has been extended three times in two-month increments, will expire on October 2. UN officials hope that this iteration of the truce will be expanded beyond two months. In an interview with Al Jazeera on Monday, Mr Grundberg said he is waiting for the warring parties to respond to a UN proposal for expanding the truce.
