

J&K to Set Sail with River Cruise Tourism

he Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) administration, in collaboration with the Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI), is embarking on a ground-breaking project to introduce river cruise tourism in the region. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed during the Chintan Shivir event (Srinagar) outlines plans to upgrade infrastructure, including the construction of floating jetties along the Chenab, Jhelum, and Ravi rivers.

The project will see the installation of 10 floating jetties at strategic locations, including Jammu, Srinagar, and Bandipora, aimed at facilitating smooth boarding and disembarkation for tourists.

The development will also include landside facilities, dredging operations, and navigational support to ensure the safety and ease of river cruise operations.

With an investment of ₹100 crore, the plan is designed to modernise infrastructure and enhance waterway connectivity across the region.

Jammu & Kashmir is set to benefit from being part of India's national waterways network. The Jammu & Kashmir government will play a vital role in land allocation, securing approvals, and managing cruise operators.

This strategic partnership is not only expected to transform the tourism industry but also create long-term economic growth for the region. Furthermore, the tourism sector has witnessed significant growth across J&K over the last four years. J&K has attracted nearly 7.5 crore visitors from 2021 to 2024. However, the Jammu region has captured the majority of the tourist footfall, receiving 86.66% of the total visitors, while Kashmir accounted for just 13.33%.

The figures, detailed in the Economic Survey 2024-25, reveal that Jammu is the primary destination, especially for religious tourists visiting places like Mata Vaishno Devi, while Kashmir has seen an increase in foreign tourist numbers. The tourism sector's growth is attributed to the Jammu & Kashmir Tourism Department's aggressive promotional efforts and participation in international events. The region's tourism spotlighted by the G20 Tourism Meeting in Srinagar in 2023 and its diverse offerings, including the Gulmarg Gondola and the annual Amarnath Yatra, have helped boost visitor numbers. Furthermore, off-beat destinations and the region's border areas have attracted significant interest, creating employment opportunities for locals.

Looking to the future, the government plans to enhance J&K's appeal by developing new tourist spots and infrastructure. These include eco-tourism parks, wellness centres, and adventure activities to diversify the tourism experience. The aim is to position J&K as a global destination by 2025, offering world-class facilities while preserving its natural charm and cultural heritage. The government has also proposed the creation of nine new tourist destinations to attract even more visitors and drive economic growth.

J&K Unveils 260 Smart City Projects

The transformation of Jammu and Kashmir as a Smart City is well underway. Jammu and Kashmir has successfully completed 260 Smart City projects at a cost of Rs 6,358.31 crore, with an additional 29 projects underway, valued at Rs 857.58 crore.

These initiatives focus on enhancing urban infrastructure, including the creation of green spaces, installation of LED street lights, and the construction of health centres and auditoriums. The Smart City Mission aims to transform Jammu and Srinagar into modern, eco-friendly urban centres.

A key development under the initiative is the deployment of 200 e-buses (100 each in Jammu and Kashmir) equipped with real-time tracking and digital ticketing systems, to improve urban mobility.
