‘AJK’ coalition warns govt to fulfil promises or face consequences

Dawn, 25 December 2024

Amid plans to expand its network to the grassroots level, a civil society coalition leading the rights movement in ‘Azad Jammu and Kashmir’ (AJK) has warned authorities to fulfil their promises within the next six months, or face the consequences.

The warning was issued during a late Monday meeting of the Jammu Kashmir Joint Action Committee’s (JKJAAC) core committee in the town of Chakswari in Mirpur district, where several other key decisions were also made.

“The JKJAAC... congratulates people of the state who played an unforgettable role in the recent movement, particularly during the long march on May 11 and the lockdown and entry point closure on Dec 5, leading to significant successes,” it said.

It reminded the government that after negotiations with an official team on Dec 8, it had given a six-month timeline for the full implementation of the approved Charter of Demands in compliance with the Feb 4 notification and a written agreement.

“During this six-month period, sub-committees of the JKJAAC will be formed at the union council and ward levels in consultation with the core committee members from the

concerned districts to enhance public mobilisation and organisation.”

The meeting announced strict adherence to its code of conduct, barring members from participating in programmes organised by other groups or organisations as JKJAAC representatives, without prior approval.

Expressing serious concern over the delay in construction of the Rathoa-Haryam Bridge, the non-implementation of reduced property transfer tax rates, frequent power outages and low voltage issues and the alleged failure to improve the supply and quality of wheat flour, the meeting warned the government to deliver on its promises or else the rulers would bear full responsibility for the consequences.

Acknowledging the trust and support of the region’s residents and overseas Kashmiris, the JKJAAC assured them that future decisions would reflect their aspirations and would be implemented with their backing.

Earthquake jolts KP and 'AJK'

An earthquake measuring 5.2 on the richter scale jolted parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Azad Jammu and Kashmir, including Peshawar and Muzaffarabad. According to a private news channel, the National Seismic Monitoring Centre in Islamabad reported that the epicenter was in the border region between Afghanistan and Tajikistan, at a depth of 212 kilometers. Tremors were felt in Peshawar, North Waziristan, Lower Dir, Malakand and AJK's Neelum Valley, causing residents to evacuate buildings in alarm. Fortunately, no

casualties or property damage have been reported.

‘Azad Kashmir’ PM vows to thwart India’s malicious plans to fuel unrest in region

‘Azad Jammu and Kashmir’ (AJK) Prime Minister Chaudhry Anwarul Haq said India was orchestrating plans for terrorist acts in the liberated territory, alleging that it had funneled money to create chaos amid protests for rights.

He was speaking at a press conference, in the company of over a dozen cabinet members, in what marked his first formal media interaction since his government, two weeks earlier, conceded to protests organised by the Jammu Kashmir Joint Awami Action Committee (JKJAAC) — a coalition of civil society organisations — and withdrew a controversial ordinance on public gatherings.

Mr Haq dismissed the notion that ‘AJK’s’ political system had weakened, maintaining that the decision to negotiate with protesters was solely the initiative of the political government and its prime minister. “Governments emerge stronger, not weaker, when they successfully navigate through crises,” he said.

“If you manage to peacefully send your citizens back through negotiations, avoiding bloodshed that could have

played into the enemy’s hands, your parliamentary system becomes one hundred per cent stronger,” Mr Haq said, adding that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his agencies, which were funding activities in ‘AJK’, sought to equate the oppression in ‘occupied Kashmir’ with the situation in ‘Azad Kashmir’.

“But here, we have an alert prime minister and an alert cabinet. Everyone understands the global challenges and the objectives behind this protest. Even the protest leadership realised that matters were slipping out of their hands. It’s easy to gather a crowd but dispersing it peacefully is a far more challenging task. Everyone played their role, and matters were resolved amicably,” the ‘AJK’ prime minister said.

He vowed to prevent unrest in the region to thwart Modi’s doctrine.

Mr Haq expressed gratitude for the youth and social media users who launched campaigns defending him, saying that “it’s a positive sign that opposition arises when you clash with the status quo and fight dishonesty”.

Expressing gratitude to the central leadership of the PML-N and PPP, Mr Haq said the government would pursue its mission of public welfare with greater vigour now that the political atmosphere in ‘AJK’ had cleared.

Strong, stable, prosperous Pakistan guarantor to success of 'Completion of Pakistan' movement: 'AJK' PM

'Azad Jammu Kashmir' Prime Minister Chaudhry Anwar ul Haq has said that a strong, stable and prosperous Pakistan was guarantor for the success of the 'Takmeel e Pakistan' (completion of Pakistan) movement.

He expressed these views while addressing a meeting of the parliamentary Kashmir Committee held at the federal metropolis on Wednesday.

Presided over by the Kashmir Committee Chairman Rana Qasim Noon, the meeting was attended by members of the committee including the PM 'AJK' Chaudhry Anwar ul Haq, President PPP 'AJK' chapter Chaudhry Yasin, and others, says an official handout issued by 'AJK' government Wednesday night.

The meeting discussed in detail the prevailing political and human rights situation in 'occupied Kashmir' and ongoing development projects in 'Azad Jammu Kashmir'.

Speaking on the occasion, Prime Minister Chudhary Anwar ul Haq said that the Kashmiris' struggle would continue till the ideology of accession to Pakistan is fully materialized. He said that the Kashmiri people's love with the state of Pakistan and its people stem from unbreakable bond of brotherhood, affinity and their deep

connection to its tradition, culture and history.

Referring to the ongoing development project in 'Azad Kashmir', the PM said that major development projects including the Mansehra-Muzaffarabad Motorway, construction of Legislative Assembly building, rehabilitation of the internally displaced people and the construction of the Rathua-Haryam Bridge would be completed within a stipulated timeframe.

He said that the coalition government have introduced major reforms in education, health, and other sectors. "Reforms being implemented in government sectors have started yielding positive results", the PM remarked.

The 'AJK' premier voiced his grave concern over the worsening human rights situation in 'Indian occupied Kashmir'.

He said that Indian forces have been involved in gross violations of basic human rights in 'occupied Jammu and Kashmir'.

"India has deprived Kashmiris of their fundamental rights of citizens", the PM Haq said, adding that United Nations must take strict notice of the war crimes being committed by the 'Indian occupation forces' against Kashmiri people and help resolve the lingering dispute in line with the UNSC resolutions.

Prime Minister Chaudhry Anwar ul Haq on the occasion thanked the federal government for providing a

grand package for 'Azad Kashmir' which enabled his government to announce subsidy on electricity and flour prices.

The PM said that electricity was being provided to citizens at three rupees per unit, while flour is also available at subsidized prices.

Meanwhile, talking to the media shortly after the end of meeting, the KC Chairman Rana Qasim Noon said that important proposals were presented in vis a vis the resolution of the Kashmir issue. Terming Pakistan and Kashmir like two bodies with one soul, Mr. Noon said, "Kashmir is the jugular vein of Pakistan".

He strongly condemned the India's relentless suppression and human rights violations in 'occupied Kashmir'.

He also voiced his concern over the Indian government's nefarious designs to alter the region's demography.

'AJK' Assembly condemns US sanctions, reaffirms support for defense

Muzaffarabad motorway plan progress reviewed

The 4th meeting of the Kashmir Committee was held under the chairmanship of Rana Qasim Noon.

The Prime Minister of 'Azad Kashmir', Chaudhry Anwar ul Haq also participated in the meeting and discussed the Kashmir issue and various developmental projects. Noon emphasised that Kashmir was the lifeline of Pakistan.

He said the people of Pakistan were extending consistent support to Kashmiris at every level. "Pakistan stands by its Kashmiri brothers and sisters on moral, diplomatic, and all other fronts," he maintained.

affected by cross-border conflicts and infrastructure development, including education and health, were highlighted.

Qasim Noon and the prime minister of 'Azad Kashmir' reaffirmed their commitment for resisting the Hindutva agenda and supporting the Kashmiri people.

The ideology of Pakistan remains central to the ongoing struggle for the rights of Kashmiris, he added.
