Armenia-France 2025 defence cooperation program signed

Armenia-France defence strategic consultations were held Tuesday at the Armenian Ministry of Defense (MoD), the latter reports. UK to join US-Bahrain Middle East security agreement

The UK is set to join a security pact between Bahrain and the US designed to build "long-term stability in the Middle East." The UK government said it would sign a deal to join the US-Bahrain Comprehensive Security Integration and Prosperity Agreement on Saturday in Manama. The original agreement between the US and Bahrain, which have longstanding security ties, was signed in September last year. At the time the State Department said it would "enhance cooperation across a wide range of areas, from defence and security to emerging trade. and investment." technology, Bahrain's foreign minister confirmed on Friday that the UK had been invited to be a partner in the agreement, Reuters reported. "The comprehensive security integration and prosperity agreement is designed not as a bilateral arrangement, but as beginning of a multilateral framework that aims to bring together countries with an equal interest in delivering stability and prosperity," Abdullatif bin Rashid Al-Zayani told the Manama Dialogue security conference in Bahrain.

India adopts balanced approach to West Asia conflict: Jaishankar in Bahrain

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Monday said India's approach to the conflict that has been going on in West Asia since last year is balanced as it looks at the issues in all their complexities and also has a fundamental commitment to justice and equity. Jaishankar, 69, also reiterated that India supports a two-state solution to the Israel-Palestine issue during an interaction with the Indian community here. As a

country that itself has been impacted so deeply by terrorism, we are very strongly opposed to terrorism and hostage-taking. They should never be excused or condoned, Jaishankar said. But at the same time, it is very important that any action which is taken by any government or any armed force must always take care of civilian casualties and must always be respectful of humanitarian law, the minister said.

Cyprus modernizes air defence capabilities with new Israeli Barak MX surface-to-air missile system

According to SigmaLive on December 3, 2024, the Cypriot National Guard received the first batch of Israeli Barak MX surfaceto-air missile systems, with additional deliveries expected to enhance the nation's defense infrastructure. The procurement, initiated under the Anastasiades government in October 2021 and continued under the Christodoulidis administration, represents a significant investment aimed at upgrading Cyprus's air defense capabilities, which currently rely on Cold War-era systems. Negotiations for the acquisition began in October 2021 under the Anastasiades administration, initially exploring a variant of Israel's Iron Dome system. However, the Barak MX was ultimately selected due to its broader operational range and compatibility with existing systems, such as the Russian-made

Buk M1-2 and Tor-M1. Finalized under the Christodoulidis administration, the Barak MX deployment aligns with Cyprus's broader defence modernization plans, which include replacing Soviet-era Mi-35 helicopters with six Airbus H145M attack helicopters by the end of 2024.

Cyprus takes delivery of Israeli air defence system, report says

Cyprus has taken delivery of an Israeli air defence system, local media reported on Thursday, as the east Mediterranean island taps new markets to upgrade its defence capabilities after the loss of key supplier Russia. TV station Sigma said the first deliveries were made on Tuesday. Cypriot officials declined to comment on the specifics of the report. "The only thing I can say is we will, and are doing everything necessary to bolster the deterrence force of Cyprus, not only because we are a country under occupation, but an EU member state in a region of particular geo-strategic importance," Cypriot President Nikos Christodoulides told reporters on Thursday. Cyprus was split in a Turkish invasion in 1974, with the internationally recognised government controlling the south, and a breakaway heavily militarised Turkish Cypriot state the north.

Cyprus turns to west for new air defence system

Cyprus is turning to the west to renew its air defence systems, a senior government source said on Thursday. The source told Reuters the country is "turning to other countries of the European Union, as well as Israel" as it seeks to replace older military hardware which had been supplied by Russia. "As part of that, efforts are underway to upgrade our anti-aircraft umbrella," the source added. Cyprus' National Guard had suffered from sanctions placed on Russia in the aftermath of the country's invasion of Ukraine in 2022. Russia had previously been a leading supplier of military hardware to the National Guard, but Cyprus' reorientation towards the west had already begun to have a detrimental impact on that infrastructure even before a blanket ban was placed on Russian military hardware exports two years ago.

Georgia's shaky path to EU creates options for Middle East

Almost a year ago, Georgia reached a milestone in its foreign policy when the European Commission announced the country was a candidate for EU membership. Despite that historic decision, Georgian Prime Minister Irakli Kobakhidze said last week that arrangements to join the bloc would be delayed, and membership talks would not be held until 2028 — a statement that led to rioting in Tbilisi. What is Georgia's path to the EU now, and the potential implications of this decision for the country; and what might these developments mean for the Middle East? Given its "small state" status, Georgia is torn between Russia and the West, especially since the outbreak of the Ukraine war. Georgia, as well as Moldova, which borders Ukraine, has been feeling the effects of the polarized political field on its ability to calibrate foreign policy. In August 2008, Russia and Georgia had a brief war, after which Moscow declared independence of South Ossetia and another breakaway province, Abkhazia, and established an armed base there.

Iran says ready to study any Syrian request for troops

Iran will consider any request from its Syrian ally for troops to help tackle a sweeping rebel offensive in the north, Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said on Tuesday. "If the Syrian government asks us to send forces to Syria, we will study their request," Araghchi said in an excerpt from an interview published on his official Telegram channel. Iran and Syria have been close allies for decades and Tehran has long provided military advisors to the Syrian

armed forces. On Monday, foreign ministry spokesman Esmaeil Baghaei said Iran's "military advisors were present in Syria, and they are still present" and would remain in the country "in accordance with the wishes" of its government. The Iranian government has been portraying the rebel assault as a US-Israeli plot to destabilize the Middle East. On Tuesday, the chief of the Iranian armed forces, General Mohammad Bagheri, called the rebel advance "dangerous for the region" according to state television. Bagheri held separate talks on Syria with his Iraqi and Syrian counterparts, as well as the Russian Defence Minister Andrei Belousov.

Iran says it conducted a successful space launch in a program long criticized by West

Iran said Friday it conducted a successful space launch, the latest in its program that the West alleges enhances Tehran's ballistic missile capabilities. Iran conducted the launch using its Simorgh program, a satellite-carrying rocket that had had a series of failed launches, at Iran's Imam Khomeini Spaceport in rural Semnan province. That's the site of Iran's civilian space program. The Simorgh carried what Iran described as an "orbital propulsion system," as well as two research systems to a 400-kilometer (250-mile) orbit above the Earth. The system could allow Iran to change the orbit of a spacecraft, something Tehran long has wanted to have geosynchronized orbits for its satellites. Iran also put the payload of the Simorgh at 300

kilograms (660 pounds), heavier than its previous successful launches.

Iran successfully launches Saman-1 space tug

The Saman-1, along with a CubeSat and a research payload, has been successfully sent into space using a Simorgh launcher, according to the chief of Iran's space agency. Hassan Salaryieh said on Saturday that Simorgh, a satellite launch vehicle (SLV), set a new record for payload liftoff on Friday. He noted that the launch of Saman-1 marked the largest and heaviest space payload sent into orbit by the country. This multi-phase mission successfully deployed the Saman-1 orbital transfer block along with two research payloads, totaling nearly 300 kilograms. The Saman-1 system is designed to elevate satellites to higher orbits and will be crucial for Iran's space program, he added. One of the mission's payloads was the Fakhr-1 communication satellite, he further noted. The Iranian Space Agency announced on Friday that initial tests indicate all subsystems of the space tug are functioning properly. Simorgh is a two-stage, liquid-fueled satellite launch vehicle developed by the Iranian Ministry of Defense.

IAEA claims Iran dramatically accelerating uranium enrichment

Iran is dramatically accelerating enrichment of uranium to up to 60% purity, a Western media outlet has cited Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Rafael Grossi as saying. "Today the agency is announcing that the production capacity is increasing dramatically of the 60% inventory," Reuters quoted Grossi who was speaking on the sidelines of the Manama Dialogue security conference in Bahrain. He claimed that Iran's production capacity was set to rise to seven, eight times more, maybe, or even more than the current level of 5-7 kg of uranium enriched to up to 60% purity a month. Reuters also claimed to have seen a confidential report to IAEA member states, which said Iran had increased enriching uranium to up to 60% at its Natanz and Fordow sites. The report claimed that Iran had increased the enrichment rate of the feed material to them into interconnected cascades of advanced IR-6 centrifuges at Fordow. Western countries accuse Iran of trying to build nuclear weapons. Iran rejects that, saying it wants nuclear energy to meet its domestic needs.

Iran says pursuing its peaceful nuclear program under IAEA supervision

Iran's Foreign Ministry Spokesman Esmail Baghaei has said that the Islamic Republic's nuclear program is peaceful and based on technical needs, and remains under supervision of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). Baghaei made the comments on Saturday, a day after IAEA Director General Rafael Grossi said that Iran is dramatically accelerating its enrichment of uranium to up to 60% purity. The spokesman said that Grossi's remarks are a reference to the "confrontational and unconstructive" action by the US, the UK, France and Germany at the IAEA's Board of Governors where they pushed for the approval of an anti-Iran resolution without any legal basis or logical justification. Baghaei also referred to Grossi's visit to Tehran three weeks ago, during which Tehran and the IAEA agreed to strengthen technical cooperation. The spokesman said that Grossi brought initiatives, but it was the US and those three European countries that caused the IAEA chief's efforts to be fruitless through pursuing a policy of pressure and exploiting the Board of Governors.

Minister: Iran plays key role in protecting global energy security

Iran's nuclear countdown: Could Bashar al-Assad's downfall accelerate the timeline?

Bashar al-Assad's government fell after a swift and meticulously coordinated rebel offensive, ending five decades of Assad family rule in Syria. The operation, led by the Islamist coalition Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) and supported by the Syrian National Army (SNA), culminated in the capture of Damascus within two weeks, following the seizure of Aleppo. The fall came as Assad's forces, weakened by years of corruption and economic mismanagement, crumbled under pressure. Reports suggest Assad has fled to Moscow as rebel leaders consolidate power in key regions. Ahmed al-Sharaa, better known as Abu Mohammed al-Golani, leader of HTS, addressed a jubilant crowd at the Umayyad Mosque in Damascus,

"How many people were declaring: displaced across the world? How many people lived in tents? How many drowned in the seas? A new history, my brothers, is being written in the entire region after this great victory." The fall of Assad's government resulted from a meticulously planned offensive that had been development for six months. Spearheaded by Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) and supported by the Syrian National Army (SNA), the operation unfolded with unprecedented speed. Within two weeks, rebels seized Aleppo and advanced southward to Damascus, culminating in the regime's collapse.

Iran assumes rotating presidency of OPEC for 2025

Iran's Oil Minister Mohsen Paknejad was appointed as Rotating President of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) Conference for 2025 by alphabetical order during a ministerial meeting on Tuesday which was held via videoconference and chaired by Marcel Abeke, the Gabonese petroleum minister and OPEC conference president for 2024. Iran has assumed the rotating presidency of the OPEC for 2025, a sign the country is still a major player in the bloc despite US sanctions seeking to restrict its oil exports. The ministerial meeting convenes twice a year to review the general affairs of the 12-

member OPEC and discuss its key internal matters. Paknejad said in the meeting that it was an honor for him and Iran as a founding member of the OPEC to assume its presidency at a time when the organization needs more unity to deal with "sensitive and complicated" issues in the global energy market.

Iran rejects E3 accusations against country's peaceful nuclear program

Iran's Foreign Ministry Spokesman Esmaeil Baghaei has rejected the claims made in a joint statement by France, Germany and the UK with regard to the recent developments in Iran's peaceful nuclear program. The decision to activate a number of advanced centrifuges at an Iranian nuclear facility was made within the framework of the rights of the parties to the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and with prior information and under the supervision of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), Baghaei said on Tuesday night, while responding to the statement of the three European countries, together known as E3 or Troika. The spokesman clarified that the Islamic Republic of Iran, as a responsible IAEA member, has proven its commitment to cooperating with the Agency, which is also evident by understandings reached during last month's visit of the IAEA Director General to Tehran. It is regrettable that the three European countries, regardless of the achievements of Rafael Grossi's visit, which could have been a basis for strengthening future cooperation, insisted on unconstructive approach and proceeded with an anti-Iran resolution at the IAEA Board of Governors meeting, he said. Remarks came a day after the E3 reiterated politicallymotivated claims and accusations that Iran is militarizing its nuclear program with an increased number of centrifuges and with preparations to install additional enrichment infrastructure.

Iran, Turkiye sign trade cooperation agreement, set \$30 billion target

Iraq deploys armoured vehicles to border with Syria

Al-Monitor, December 2, 2024

Iraq sent armoured vehicles on Monday to reinforce its long border with Syria, in a bid to ease concerns after a surprise offensive in the neighbouring country by Islamist-led insurgents. The lightning offensive by Islamist Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) group and allied factions saw government forces lose full control of Syria's second city Aleppo for the first time since the civil war began in 2011. The attacks have caused

unease in Iraq, which still bears the scars of decades of conflict, including the rise of jihadists from the Islamic State (IS) group. "Any infiltration on the Syrian-Iraqi border is absolutely impossible, because of the fortifications and the combat units located there," interior ministry spokesman General Moqdad Miri said on Monday. The defence ministry said "armoured units of the Iraqi army" were sent to reinforce the border, from the western border town of Al-Qaim to the border with Jordan further south. Similar forces were deployed along the border further north in Nineveh province, it said. The move comes after the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights reported 200 fighters from a pro-Iran Iraqi armed group being sent into Syria to support government forces.

Iran-backed Iraqi militias enter Syria to help govt fighting rebels

Hundreds of fighters from Iran-backed Iraqi militias crossed into Syria overnight to help the government fight rebels who seized Aleppo last week, Syrian and Iraqi sources said on Monday, and Tehran pledged to aid the Damascus government. At least 300 fighters, primarily from the Badr and Nujabaa groups, crossed late on Sunday using a dirt road to avoid the official border crossing, two Iraqi security sources said, adding that they were there to defend a Shi'ite shrine. A senior Syrian military source said the fighters had crossed in small groups to avoid airstrikes. "These are fresh reinforcements being sent to aid

our comrades on the front lines in the north," the source said. The head of Iraq's Popular Mobilisation Forces said no group under its umbrella had entered Syria, and that it does not operate outside Iraq. Iran's constellation of allied regional militia groups has long been integral to the success of pro-government forces in subduing rebels who rose up against President Bashar al-Assad in 2011, and they have long maintained bases in Syria.

Amnesty International investigation concludes Israel is committing genocide against Palestinians in Gaza

Amnesty International's research has found sufficient basis to conclude that Israel has committed and is continuing to commit genocide against Palestinians in the occupied Gaza Strip, the organization said in a landmark new report published today. The report, 'You Feel Like You Subhuman': Israel's Genocide Against Palestinians in Gaza, documents during its military offensive launched in the wake of the deadly Hamas-led attacks in southern Israel on 7 October 2023, Israel has unleashed hell and destruction on Palestinians in Gaza brazenly, continuously and with total impunity. "Amnesty International's report demonstrates that Israel has carried out acts prohibited under the Genocide Convention, with the specific intent to destroy Palestinians in Gaza. These acts include killings, causing serious bodily or mental harm and deliberately inflicting on Palestinians in Gaza conditions of life calculated to bring about their physical destruction. Month after month, Israel has treated Palestinians in Gaza as subhuman group unworthy of human rights and dignity, demonstrating its intent to physically destroy them," said Agnès Callamard, Secretary General of Amnesty International. "Our damning findings must serve as a wake-up call to

the international community: this is genocide. It must stop now.

China's ties with Saudi Arabia buoyed by green tech

Chinese exports and investment are pouring into Saudi Arabia as the kingdom's demand for green tech deepens a relationship once defined by oil sales and challenges business ties with its traditional western partners. Bilateral trade has for many years been almost totally dominated by Chinese purchases of Saudi oil. But now, Chinese exports to Saudi Arabia are tracking towards a record high, at \$40.2bn in the first 10 months of the year, up from \$34.9bn for the same period last year, according to Chinese government data. China has also become the

kingdom's largest source of greenfield foreign direct investment, with investments from 2021 to October this year totalling \$21.6bn, about a third of which were in clean technologies such as batteries, solar and wind, according to investments tracked by fDi Markets. This compares with \$12.5bn from the US, the next highest. The figures herald a change, with China eclipsing the kingdom's traditional investment partners, the US and France. Many of the Chinese deals have yet to show up in official Saudi figures, indicating the capital has yet to be deployed.

Its transformation is marked by a centralised command structure, specialised combat units, advanced weaponry, and developed locally manufacturing capabilities, as reported by the Financial Times. This shift underscores HTS's evolving role in Syria's prolonged conflict and its challenge to regional stability. The changes in HTS's operations and structure have been striking. The group now boasts a military academy, rapid-deployment specialist units, and the capacity to manufacture weapons domestically. As told to the Financial Times, Aaron Zelin, an expert on the group at the Washington Institute, observed, "It has transformed over the past four, five years into essentially a polished proto-military."

This geographical position, combined with deep historical and cultural ties to Ukraine's Crimea, positions Turkey as a key player in Black Sea security. Recent years witnessed significant changes in the Eurasian security framework. Russia's belligerent posture in Ukraine and questions over the United States' changes in its enduring commitment to European security have renewed demands for a more autonomous and more powerful European defense mechanism.

India, France, UAE strengthen defence ties with Desert Knight air combat exercise

India, France, and the UAE began a major air combat exercise, "Desert Knight," on Wednesday over the Arabian Sea. The operation aims to enhance trilateral defence cooperation and foster better interoperability among their air forces during complex combat scenarios, as reported by TOI. The Indian Air Force

(IAF) participated with aircraft such as Sukhoi-30MKIs and Jaguars, along with IL-78 mid-air refuellers and AEW&C (airborne early-warning and control) systems, operating from Jamnagar on India's west coast. French Rafale jets and UAE's F-16 fighters were deployed from the Al Dhafra airbase in the UAE. The exercise, described as a "large force engagement," featured intensive combat manoeuvres approximately 350-400 km southwest of Karachi over the Arabian Sea. As told to TOI, a source close to the exercise shared, "The Desert Knight exercise will continue for three days. It is the second such trilateral endeavour this year to build synergy among the three air forces as well as improve combat skills, with multiple aircraft types operating in a realistic scenario."

US Navy destroys Houthi missiles and drones targeting American ships in Gulf of Aden

US Navy destroyers shot down seven missiles and drones fired by Yemen's Houthi rebels at the warships and three American merchant vessels they were escorting through the Gulf of Aden. No damage or injuries were reported. US Central Command said late Sunday that the destroyers USS Stockdale and USS O'Kane shot down and destroyed three anti-ship ballistic missiles, three drones and one antiship cruise missile. The merchant ships were not identified. The Houthis claimed the attack in a statement and said they had targeted the US destroyers and "three supply ships belonging to the American army in the Arabian Sea and the Gulf of Aden." Houthi attacks for months have

targeted shipping through a waterway where \$1 trillion in goods pass annually over the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza and Israel's ground offensive in Lebanon. A ceasefire was announced in the latter last week.

Yemen's Houthis and Russia: Why their growing ties matter

Since the 7 October Hamas attack on Israel, the Houthi movement has emerged as one of the most active and capable members of Iran's so-called 'Axis of Resistance' - an alliance built over years of Iranian support to counter Israeli and US influence in the Middle East. Over the past year, the Yemeni group has intensified threats to global naval trade by attacking commercial shipping in the Red Sea and Bab el-Mandeb while defying US-led efforts to neutralise its arsenal. Despite growing ties with Tehran and alignment with other members of the Axis, the Houthis remain the most autonomous entity in Iran's network. They have distinct regional ambitions, forging new partnerships beyond the Middle East. According to Eleonora Ardemagni, a senior associate research fellow at the Italian Institute for International Political Studies (ISPI), the Houthis' primary aim is to strengthen their decision-making autonomy and influence, both within the Axis and beyond. "The Houthis are building their own 'network of resistance'," she told The New Arab, highlighting alliances with Shia

militias in Iraq, Somalia's Al-Shabab, and even al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP).

Houthis claim attack on central Israel in response to Gaza 'massacres'

Yemen's Houthi group says it has carried out a drone attack in central Israel's Tel Aviv area in "a specific military operation" in support of Palestinians in Gaza. The Houthis said in a statement on Monday that their forces struck "a sensitive target of the enemy". An Israeli military statement said a drone hit a building in the city of Yavne after air defence systems failed to detect it and an investigation into the failure is under way. The Houthis said the operation "achieved its objective" without providing details. No injuries were reported in the attack, which caused damage to several apartments in the building, according to Israeli media reports. The Houthis said the attack was in response to Israel's "massacres" against Palestinians in the besieged Gaza Strip, where Israel has been waging a devastating assault for more than a year. The Houthis - who control large areas of Yemen, including the capital, Sanaa, and present themselves as the country's official armed forces – pledged to continue their attacks on Israel until the end of the war on Gaza.

Israel says its air strikes destroyed most of Syria's strategic weapons stockpiles

Israel aims to impose a "sterile defence zone" in southern Syria that would be enforced without a permanent troop presence, Defence Minister Israel Katz said on Tuesday, as the military said a wave of air strikes had destroyed the bulk of Syria's strategic weapons stockpiles. Over the past 48 hours, following the collapse of the government of President Bashar al-Assad, the military said jets had conducted more than 350 strikes on targets including antibatteries. military aircraft airfields, weapons production sites, combat aircraft and missiles. In addition, missile vessels struck the Syrian naval facilities of Al-Bayda port and Latakia port, where 15 Syrian naval vessels were docked. Israeli officials said the strikes across Syria were aimed at destroying strategic weapons and military infrastructure to prevent them being used by rebel groups that drove Assad from power, some of which grew from movements linked to al Qaeda and Islamic State.
