But the presence of two Chinese navy corvettes, which first arrived in December, is hard to miss. Docked at a 1,000-foot pier, they are visible from the village's main road. Initially, the Cambodian military said the ships were there to help with training.

China's H-6K bomber displays high ballistic missile-carrying capacity

An official photo recently released by the Chinese military showed the outstanding capability of the H-6K bomber in carrying air-launched ballistic missiles - capable of carrying four instead of two previously shown to the public. The photo, published in a release posted in the WeChat account of the air force of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) Southern Theater Command, showed an H-6K bomber taking off ahead of a mid-night exercise at an undisclosed date in the summer. Observers pointed out that the H-6K in the photo carried two air-launched ballistic missiles, dubbed the YJ-21 by foreign media, under one side of its wings, indicating that it very likely carried four missiles in total under two wings, considering the need to keep balance.

A collaborative team of Chinese and French researchers has successfully completed a mission to measure the distribution of radon gas and polonium on the moon, employing the French payload aboard China's Chang'e-6 lunar probe for the purpose, according to the Institute of Geology and Geophysics (IGG) of the Chinese Academy of Sciences. The French payload, named Detection of Outgassing RadoN (DORN), is capable of measuring both radon gas and its decay products on the lunar surface, as well as charged particles in the space environment.

After a long freeze in joint counternarcotics work between the countries, President Biden and Chinese leader Xi Jinping pledged to resume cooperation at a summit in California last November. Since then, Chinese authorities have quietly shut down some sellers of precursor chemicals used by Mexican cartels to make fentanyl and say they are close to imposing new regulations sought by the U.S. on three additional chemicals.

China plans to use drones to blockade Taiwan after US unveils 'Hellscape' strategy

The Chinese military has claimed that it has the capability to impose and maintain a blockade on an island, solely using drones. The claim has been made in a peer-reviewed paper in the Chinese academic journal Command Control & Simulation, published last month. According to Chen Huijie, an engineer with the 92116 unit of the People's Liberation Army (PLA) and the project lead of the research, a simulation was run over an unnamed island with a narrow shape similar to Taiwan's terrain. The objective of the mission was to form a blockade and control the island which had been fortified with a large number of air defence missile launchers, while hostile warships and submarines prowled the surrounding waters.

US, China ramp up uranium imports from Russia

In May, the United States purchased about 91 tons of enriched uranium from Russia, valued at \$210 million, according to Russian media reports. This marks the highest amount since March 2023, when imports totaled \$246 million. Russian shipments accounted for 21.5% of the total enriched uranium the U.S. bought in May 2024. Interestingly, while China was the largest exporter of enriched uranium to the U.S. in May, it also became the largest importer of Russian enriched uranium in May, purchasing a multi-year record amount of \$233 million. The last time China imported such a large quantity of enriched uranium from Russia in a single month was in 2015.

China's new interception radar 'can track 10 hypersonic missiles at Mach 20'

Chinese scientists say they have achieved an advance in radar technology that may turn up the heat in the race for hypersonic weapons. The project team led by Zheng Xiaoping, a professor with Tsinghua University's department of electronic engineering, said it had built a radar capable of tracking 10 incoming hypersonic missiles at Mach 20 with unprecedented precision, and it could also identify false targets. During ground-based simulations, the new radar showed an error of 28cm (11 inches) in estimating the distance of a missile travelling at nearly 7km (4.3 miles) per second, and it was up to 99.7 per cent accurate when estimating the missile's speed, the team said of a feat previously thought to be impossible.

China develops new stealth aircraft likely to be deployed on carriers

China is developing a new stealth combat aircraft to be deployed on an aircraft carrier, Nikkei has learned. It will be a fifth-generation fighter jet with a stealth function and is expected to be deployed on China's third aircraft carrier, the Fujian. The new jet's capability would raise the People's Liberation Army's ability to execute its strategies in the air and on the sea, increasing the country's threats to Japan and Taiwan. Shenyang Aircraft Industry Group in late June showed a movie of its newest stealth aircraft, the Jian31B or J-31B, to the public. The text in the movie

reads "From the land base to marine base." A source in Japan's security authorities said the jet was built with the use on aircraft carriers in mind.

China-France astronomical satellite detects three GRBs

The Sino-French astronomical satellite called Space Variable Objects Monitor (SVOM) has reportedly detected three gamma-ray bursts (GRBs). The coordinates of these GRBs have already been submitted to the General Coordinates Network (GCN), according to the China News Service. According to the project team of the Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS) involved in the SVOM mission, after the satellite was launched on June 22, its gamma-ray detector was officially put into operation on June 24. Subsequent activation of the detector's high voltage systems during on-orbit testing on June 27 allowed it to capture its first gamma-ray burst that same day, marking the satellite's initial scientific achievement in orbit.

China's plenum must offer action not rote slogans

The mood in China is dismal. Indicators of domestic and foreign sentiment — household consumption, private investment and inflows of foreign capital — have been anaemic. Property values continue to fall and the stock market is in the doldrums, both reflecting and feeding into the sense that the economy is rudderless and that the government either doesn't understand the gravity of the situation or doesn't have a plan to stem the rot. Or both. U.S. Coast Guard encounters People's Republic of China military naval presence in Bering Sea

The U.S. Coast Guard encountered multiple People's Republic of China military ships in the Bering Sea. The crew of U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Kimball (WMSL 756) detected three vessels approximately 124 miles north of the Amchitka Pass in the Aleutian Islands, and an HC-130J aircrew from U.S. Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak detected an additional vessel approximately 84 miles north of the Amukta Pass. All four of the People's Republic of China vessels were transiting in international waters but still inside the U.S. Exclusive Economic Zone, which extends 200 nautical miles from the U.S. shoreline.

The attacks have threatened infrastructure, energy and trade projects that have kept Pakistan's economy afloat through a dire economic crisis.
