### World's first commercial small modular reactor powers up 'brain' in China

The main control room of China's "Linglong One," the world's first commercial small modular reactor (SMR) on land, officially went into operation in south China's Hainan Province, marking

the start of a peak system equipment installation period for the reactor. Just like the brain in the human body, the control room acts as the central nervous system for the plant. As the digital control network is gradually brought online, staff have begun testing equipment, monitoring its operation, and issuing commands from this critical hub. Zhao Long, deputy director of engineering management at China National Nuclear Corporation's (CNNC) Hainan branch, told China Media Group (CMG) that "compared with other nuclear power units, the Linglong One's main control room equipment is more integrated and streamlined, and its safety of various operations has been greatly upgraded."

Shapps said that new US and British intelligence "can reveal that lethal aid is now or will be flowing from China to Russia and into Ukraine". He gave no details. The revelation follows a visit by Russian President Vladimir Putin to China last week for two days of talks with Chinese President Xi Jinping. At a defence

conference in London, Shapps said that China and Russia had developed a "deeper relationship" and the flow of weapons to Russia was "new intelligence which leads me to be able to declassify and reveal this today".

### Cambodia's planned canal isn't in its own interest, only China's

Plans for a 180-kilometre canal to connect Phnom Penh with the Cambodian coast should be put on hold pending an independent review of the project's rationale and environmental impact.

Currently, state-owned China Bridge and Road Corp. is on track to begin construction of the Funan Techo canal later this year, with the \$1.7 billion project scheduled for completion by 2028. Significantly, the mouth of the canal lies about 70 kilometres east of Ream Naval Base, which appears to have become a de facto outpost of the Chinese Navy. Analysis of satellite imagery by the Asia Maritime Transparency Initiative of the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington has indicated that two Chinese warships have been effectively stationed at Ream since early December.

### Addition of three US firms to unreliable entities list 'normal,' says MOFCOM

He Yadong, spokesperson for MOFCOM, made the remarks after the ministry announced the inclusion of three US companies - Boeing Defence, Space & Security, General Atomics Aeronautical Systems, and General Dynamics Land Systems - to the unreliable entities list for selling arms to China's Taiwan region. They will be barred from engaging in China-related import or export activities, and are forbidden from making new investments in China.

Alexander Yuk Ching Ma, 71, of Honolulu, who served as a CIA officer over a seven-year period in the 1980s, worked with an unnamed co-conspirator in 2001 to provide Chinese intelligence "with a large volume of classified U.S. national defence information" in exchange for tens of thousands of dollars, DOJ said, citing the plea agreement.

# China's largest general-purpose precision survey telescope to be based in Qinghai

China's largest general-purpose precision survey telescope is expected to be based in Lenghu town, Northwest China's Qinghai Province, after a cooperation agreement was signed on Sunday between the Purple Mountain Observatory (PMO) of the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the government of the Haixi Mongolian and Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture in Qinghai. The 4.2-meter diameter ground-based specialized astrometric telescope is optimally designed for high-precision astrometric measurements of solar system objects, with an investment of about 300 million yuan (\$41 million), Ping Yiding, a senior engineer at the PMO explained, as reported by China News Service.

### Shenzhou XVIII crew conducts first spacewalk

The Shenzhou XVIII crew conducted their first spacewalk outside the Tiangong space station, completing several assignments, according to the China Manned Space Agency. The agency said in a news release that mission commander Senior Colonel Ye Guangfu and crew member Lieutenant Colonel Li Guangsu returned to the Wentian science module at 6:58 pm after floating nearly eight and a half hours outside the colossal orbital station. The third crew member, Lieutenant Colonel Li Cong, stayed inside Tiangong to provide support, it said. The Shenzhou XVIII trio, the seventh group of inhabitants of the Chinese space station, were launched on April 25 by a Long March 2F carrier rocket from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in northwestern China and arrived at the Tiangong station the next morning to take over from their peers in the Shenzhou XVIII flight.

# China's Ceres-1 pulls off second successful sea launch, demonstrating increased maturity and enhanced adaptability for commercial use

China's Ceres-1 solid rocket has successfully conducted a second sea launch afternoon off the coast of East China's Shandong Province. This milestone highlights the commercial rocket's increased maturity and enhanced adaptability, positioning it to meet diverse orbital launch mission requirements for commercial missions, according to space experts. The Ceres-1 sea launch model, developed by Galactic Energy based on the Ceres-1 rocket, is tailored for sea launches. Ceres-1 has a diameter of 1.4 meters, a length of about 20 meters, a mass at take-off of about 33 tons and a liquid propellant upper stage. It can deliver 400 kilograms to LEO or 300 kilograms to a 500-kilometer-altitude sun-synchronous orbit (SSO).

### China to impose export controls on aviation equipment, technology

China will impose export controls on billions of dollars of aviation equipment, technology and software, a move it said was aimed at enhancing national security. The controls, beginning July 1, will apply to dozens of products including aircraft engines, gas turbine engines, astronaut helmet visors and a polyethylene fiber commonly used in bulletproof jackets, as well as various technologies, software and data used to develop them, China's Commerce Ministry, customs agency and Central Military Commission said in a joint statement.

### Chinese private rocket firm completes milestone launch
